We need your help in making a child's Secret Snowman wish come true!

This holiday season District 35, the Glencoe PTO and the Glencoe Junior High Project (GJHP) are working together to support families in need at the Chavez Elementary Multicultural Academy in Chicago.

Students at Chavez are writing letters to their "Secret Snowman," briefly introducing themselves and describing a few special items they would like to receive this holiday season. Many of these children do not typically receive gifts during the holidays. Please help fulfill their wishes by choosing to sponsor a child (or two).

To sponsor a child:

- Click the link below and sign up to confirm your participation by October 25.
- Your sponsored Chavez child's Secret Snowman letter will be sent home with your District 35 student the week of November 6. If you have siblings in the District, please Specify ONE student when registering and we will send the letter home with that student.
- Shop for one or more of the items on your sponsored child's wish list. We estimate all gifts on each child's wish list will total approximately \$30.
- Please WRAP all gifts, as they will be delivered directly to the Chavez student!
- IMPORTANT! You must also LABEL each gift as follows:
 - Label EVERY gift with the sponsored student's NAME & NUMBER listed on your Secret Snowman letter. (The letter will contain a number in the upper left corner)
 - Attach the Secret Snowman letter to your gift. (Chavez School requires the letters in order to distribute gifts at their school.)
- Drop off your WRAPPED and LABELED gift(s) at Misner Auditorium at Central School on November 30 or December 1, from 8:30am to 4pm. Please use the Misner entrance at 621 Grove Street. Volunteers will be on-site collecting the gifts. IMPORTANT: Please do not try to access Misner Auditorium via the main Central School entrance at 620 Greenwood Avenue. Use the Grove Street entrance on the other side of the building ONLY.
